

During the American Revolution, the 13 colonies were fighting for independence from Britain. In 1777, the Continental Congress decided it was time for the new nation to have a flag of its own. On June 14, 1777, they passed a law that said: "Resolved, That the flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field..."

Each stripe stood for one of the 13 original colonies. The stars—arranged in a circle—represented unity, showing that all the colonies were equal and working together. The flag quickly became a symbol of freedom and courage. As new states joined the country, more stars were added. Today, the flag has 50 stars for the 50 states, but it still keeps the original 13 stripes to remember where we started.

What do the colors mean? Red stands for bravery. White stands for purity and honesty. Blue stands for justice and determination. The American flag is sometimes called "Old Glory" or "The Stars and Stripes." On the 4th of July, you'll see it waving proudly to celebrate freedom and the people who helped shape our country.

FIREWORKS IN A JAR

To make your own colorful "fireworks," fill a clear jar with warm water. In a separate bowl, mix several drops of food coloring with 2–3 tablespoons of cooking oil, then stir gently with a fork. Slowly pour the oil and color mixture into the jar and watch as the droplets sink and burst into swirls of color. This experiment is a great way to explore how oil and water don't mix, and how the food coloring behaves differently based on density. Try using cold water or adding more oil and ask your child to predict what might happen.

RED, WHITE & BLUE NATURE WALK

Take a walk outdoors and look for things in nature that match the colors of the American flag. Keep an eye out for red berries, white flowers, or bluebirds. Encourage children to sketch or photograph their discoveries. Back at home, create a nature journal entry with drawings and notes, and talk about how each color connects to the values represented in the flag.

STAR-SPANGLED SALT PAINTING

To create this sparkly patriotic art, start by using white glue to draw stars and stripes on a piece of heavy paper. While the glue is still wet, sprinkle salt over the lines and shake off any extra. While it is still wet, use a paintbrush to lightly dab watercolor paint or diluted food coloring onto the salt. The paint will spread through the salt like magic, creating a beautiful, textured effect. Let it dry completely before displaying.




Conestoga Valley Homeschoolers is a Christ-based, parent-led co-op, offering classes for preschool through high school, as well as nursery care.




